Shaamo'sh (Hello)





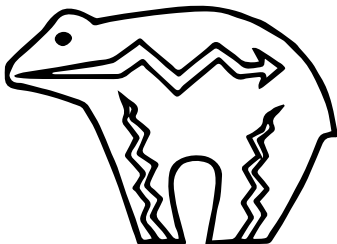
Shaamo'sh fellow Salinans.
